


PAPER PUZZLER

Imagine a paper puzzle with content messages hidden deep inside its folds! Finding the messages is a puzzling challenge! However, better than that is the fact that your participants will keep this handout to show others while reviewing your content at the same time!


Square in the middle




Directions

1. Taking a copy of the following template, widthwise fold the paper into half and then in half again so that the paper is evenly divided into four sections.


Then cutting on the dotted lines only, cut out a flap from the middle of the paper — leaving one edge of the flap attached to the paper as in the diagram.




2. Laying the paper on the table in front of you as in the diagram, fold the far left panel over on top of the panel to its right.




3. Pull the flap completely under the paper so that it sticks out from under the left edge of the paper.




4. Fold this entire flap up over the top of the paper so that the flap now lies on top of the packet.




5. Holding the flap down so that it doesn't fold back, fold the two right-hand panels over the packet to the left.




6. Now fold the left hand panel over the top of the right-hand panel.



7. Then fold the flap piece over the top of the left-hand piece so that it lays on top of the packet.



8. Finally, take a piece of clear tape and tape the flap to the first single piece of paper directly under it. Be sure to tape the flap to only the single piece of paper!



Now...open the assembled paper puzzle like a book (from left to right) — folding that front cover clear around to the underside of the packet. You are now looking at the front of the paper puzzle. By repeating this same series of openings to the paper puzzle and bending it back on its spines, you'll be able to open THE SPINES to discover completely new inside surfaces. You'll actually have three different internal surfaces. Hide your secret summary message on the innermost surface and your trainees will have great fun trying to find it!

As still yet another idea, the Paper Puzzler makes a very unique table tent for displaying participants' names at the training table.
